### **AIMS**

To establish among people in Canberra who regularly use illicit drugs:

- 1. Engagement with the Canberra fixed-site drug checking service
- 2. Reasons for and against accessing the service

### **Ecstasy and Related Drugs Reporting System (EDRS)**

Interviews with cross-sectional samples of people in Canberra who regularly use ecstasy and/or other illicit stimulants, recruited via social media, word-of-mouth (n=~100 annual)

### **Illicit Drug Reporting** System (IDRS)

Interviews with cross-sectional samples of people in Canberra who regularly inject drugs, recruited via needle-syringe programs and word-ofmouth (n=~100 annual)

July Fixed-site service opens

October **ACT Gov** commits to pilot service

July **Positive** evaluation, continued to 2024





### Conclusions

- 1. People are engaging (repeatedly) with the service to address concerns around adulteration and reduce risk of harm.
- 2. Findings reinforce drug checking as a positive social network intervention.
- 3. Opportunity to raise awareness around uncertainty and risks in current drug markets.
- 4. Opportunity for complementary service models tailored to diverse needs (e.g., outreach with portable devices).
