Part-time MBA and Graduate Certificate Programs

Recognition of Prior Learning (Credit Transfer) Procedure

The AGSM seeks to ensure the highest quality learning experience for all students. When a student can demonstrate mastery in a specific topic area, AGSM Programs may award Recognised Prior Learning (RPL) for that course.

In all cases, RPL is at the discretion of the Program Authority; this RPL procedure may change at any time without notice. The ability to apply for RPL is strictly governed by the guidelines below:

- Prospective students are expected to apply for RPL during their application process
- In accordance with UNSW Recognition of Prior Learning (Coursework Programs) policy, students may be granted RPL for no more than up to 50% of a UNSW program. This means a maximum of 6 courses can be credited towards an MBA, and up to 2 courses towards a Graduate Certificate.
- All courses submitted for consideration for RPL must have been completed in English

AGSM MBA (Executive), MBAX and Graduate Certificate Programs

- RPL may be made available for core courses only
- Except where noted below, RPL is not available for elective, specialisation and Executive Year courses

Postgraduate degrees and courses

- RPL for core courses may be granted for postgraduate degrees and courses completed up to 10 years prior to admission where there is 70% or greater match in course content
- Students must demonstrate a level of mastery equivalent to a Credit (65) or better

Undergraduate degrees

- RPL for core courses may be granted for undergraduate degrees, subject to meeting the criteria below:
 - With either a Major or Specialisation in the course topic requested, and a level of mastery equivalent to a Credit (65) or better
 - Where the undergraduate degree was completed up to 6 years prior to admission, students must demonstrate recent, professional management experience in that specific area of 2 years or more. Professional Reference(s) are required to support the application
 - Where the undergraduate degree was completed more than 6 years prior to admission, students must demonstrate recent, professional management experience in that specific area of 5 years or more. Professional Reference(s) may be required to support the application
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AGSM Executive Education

- RPL for two unspecified elective courses may be granted for students who have successfully completed an AGSM Certificate of Executive Management & Development (CEMD) up to 4 years prior to admission or during your AGSM program
- For AGSM Graduate Certificate students, the remaining 2 courses must be approved AGSM Award courses specific to the Graduate Certificate specialisation

Professional Qualification (e.g. CAANZ, CPA Australia, CFA)

- Students seeking this RPL must provide confirmation of current membership in Good Standing from the relevant institute
 - Current CAANZ/CPA Australia members in good standing are eligible for RPL for two Core courses: AGSM6210 Accounting and Financial Management and AGSM6321 Corporate Finance
 - Current CFA members in good standing are eligible for RPL for one Core course: AGSM6321 Corporate Finance

Graduates of AGSM's Graduate Certificates or The Centre for Social Impact's Graduate Certificate in Social Impact (GCSI) admitted into MBA (Executive) or MBAX

AGSM's Graduate Certificates and The Centre for Social Impact's Graduate Certificate in Social Impact (GCSI)

- Graduates of AGSM's Graduate Certificates or The Centre for Social Impact's Graduate Certificate in Social Impact (GCSI), with Credit average (65) or better may be eligible for RPL of up to 4 courses, if the courses were completed up to 10 years prior to admission. Courses will be mapped across to the appropriate Core and Elective courses

Applying for RPL

- It is expected that students commencing their studies with formal and/or informal learning will apply for RPL during their Admissions phase
- Students who obtain accreditation for other studies obtained *during* their studies with AGSM may apply to Student Experience for RPL subject to the conditions below
 - Students considering undertaking study at another institution while also enrolled in a degree program at UNSW should note that both institutions need to be applied to and approve this proposed concurrent enrolment prior to commencement. Applications for RPL for unapproved courses undertaken at another institution while enrolled in an AGSM Award program will not be considered available for any kind of RPL.  - If students finalise new formal learning accreditation after commencing their Award Program at AGSM (e.g. completing an Accounting degree commenced but not completed when entering the program), and wish to apply for RPL, they must advise Admissions of the incomplete study at the time of Admissions and not enrol in that course in the interim. Once they have completed their study, they should make their RPL application and await the outcome. Current student RPL applications are submitted via the [UNSW Student Web Forms site](#). Your



application will be considered in line with the above criteria for formal learning accreditation attained after your commencement.

Step 1 - Read and abide by AGSM's Part-time MBA and Graduate Certificate Programs RPL Procedure

Step 2 - Familiarise yourself with the program, structures, course summaries and overviews on the AGSM website

Step 3 - For assessment, please include all required documents including a completed [RPL application form](#) and forward to AGSM Recruitment and Admissions team. Please note: current AGSM students should submit their applications via the [UNSW Student Web Forms site](#).

- Documentation supporting your application must be in English. Documents which are not originally in English must be translated by a NAATI certified translator and certified.

• **Timing**

Students should anticipate being notified of the outcome of their application within 3 weeks of receipt of all required documentation as outlined on the application form. An incomplete application will not be considered.

Possible outcomes

Successful: Unless you formally decline the offered RPL, approved RPL will appear on your Academic Statement with the Grade if an UNSW course and as 'T' for transfer for external courses. It is your responsibility to check details are correct in myUNSW within your first Term.

Declined: RPL is not approved at the discretion of the Program Director. RPL decisions are final and there will be no correspondence.

Waiver offered: You have been approved not to do the course but have not been credited the Units of Credit (UOC) and will need to choose another core or elective course to study.

Please note

Program readmission or articulation

- Students who are readmitting to, or articulating into, an AGSM program will have their RPL reassessed in accordance with the policy in effect at the time of their new admission. Previously approved credit or exemptions from a prior program of study are not guaranteed to be retained and will be subject to review under the current policy.

Internal Program Transfer

- If transferring between AGSM programs, students may lose RPL already granted, for example if it is no longer within AGSM's 10-year timeframe and/or within the eligible criteria for that program.

Program Extensions

- If requesting an extension of the timeframe for your program, please note that previously awarded RPL may 'drop' off if it is no longer within AGSM's 10-year timeframe.



WAM following RPL

- If the RPL approved is for course(s) completed at other institutions, grades achieved for those courses will not be included on your Academic Statement, official UNSW Academic Transcript or in the calculation of your Weighted Average Mark (WAM)
- If the RPL approved is for course(s) completed at UNSW, grades achieved for the specific course(s) will be included on your Academic Statement and will be included in the calculation of your WAM for your new program but will not appear on your official UNSW Academic Transcript under your new program. The courses will remain on your academic transcript under your old program.

International options

- In all International programs, preference is given to students who have undertaken more AGSM courses and those more progressed in their program. Some International offerings have other terms and conditions which will be made available at the time of applications opening. Please refer to the AGSM Student Intranet for further information.
- In line with UNSW policy, at least 50% of program requirements must be completed at UNSW for the award of a UNSW postgraduate coursework degree. As international exchange is considered external study outside UNSW, accepting RPL may impact your eligibility to participate in an exchange program.

Rescind RPL

- In some circumstances a person may wish to rescind previously approved RPL, for example if they wish to undertake a course and have no 'room' left in their program. Please discuss with Student Experience if you wish to explore this option.
