Terminology	Definition
Program compulsory core & flexible core courses	36UOC of compulsory core courses and 24UOC of flexible core courses which students must complete under this degree.
Commerce Major	A sequence of approved courses (48UOC) in an approved discipline stream offered by the UNSW Business School (See Appendix A.), containing at least 18UOC at level 3. (Note that the 48UOC includes the first disciplinary course(s) in the Core (Compulsory or Flexible). This means that, for the majority of majors, students will complete 42UOC in specified disciplinary courses outside the core, except for the Real Estate Studies major.) One course within the major is to be in the international-labelled course in the relevant discipline, such as: ACCT3601, ECON2111, ECON2322, ECON3104, ECON3116, FINS3616, FINS3650, TABL2756, TABL2790, TABL3791, MARK2071, MGMT2101, MGMT2102, MGMT3102, MGMT3701.
Focussed International Studies	Accounts for 24UOC (4 courses). These courses are from UNSW Arts & Social Sciences and are to be taken within ONE area of Asian Studies, Development Studies, European Studies, Globalisation Studies, International Relations, Language Studies, Politics or History (Refer to Handbook). If a student wishes to complete a major or minor in their chosen International Studies area by using some UOC from their Free Electives, please refer to the Online Handbook website for details of the courses and requirements.
Studies of the region	Accounts for 12UOC (2 courses). These courses are part of the 48UOC completed while undertaking the compulsory one year exchange at an overseas institution. This exchange, or Commerce Overseas Program (COP), is to be taken during your 4th and 5th semester of (full-time) study, i.e. during semester 2 of Year 2 and semester 1 of Year 3. Approved Studies

	of the Region courses must relate to the country or region of the COP placement - for example, language of the region, history of the region, geography of the region, politics or business practices of the regions - or be international or global in nature. Studies of the Region courses are separate to the Commerce depth component and the Focussed International Studies component. The Studies of the Region courses need to be approved by the <u>UNSW Business School Student</u> <u>Centre.</u> To proceed on the Commerce Overseas Program (COP) students must have achieved satisfactory academic progress in their first and second years of study and must fulfil the requirements of the University's Exchange Program.
Free Electives or Second major or Commerce minor	Account for 48-54UOC (8-9 courses). Students are free to use these UOC to complete courses from any Faculty however they need to be mindful of the program limit on Level 1 courses (84UOC) when making their selection. Ways to use these UOC include: completing a range of courses across different Faculties; completing a second business major or commerce minor; expanding the International Studies courses into a major or minor. Courses cannot double count in two majors.
