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Message from the Director

UNSW is committed to removing systemic barriers to access higher education. This commitment is central to our UNSW Strategy: Progress for All, our mission and our core values, and is reflected in the work of UNSW Gateway.

That work has contributed to UNSW maintaining its position as the preferred Sydney university among students from low-socioeconomic backgrounds, based on Universities Admissions Centre preference data. It is also making a measurable difference to the UNSW community, with 25% of commencing domestic undergraduates now either coming from a low-socioeconomic background, identifying as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, or attending a Gateway partner school.

The success of UNSW Gateway is reflected in the experiences and outcomes of our students. Those who engage with our Gateway Programs and enter through the Gateway Admission Pathway establish an early sense of belonging and succeed at university, achieving median weighted average marks on par with those of their peers despite some entering through adjusted ATARs.

Our support begins well before students apply. We believe academic attainment underpins long-term success at university, which is why the Gateway Programs engage students in Years 9 to 12 through evidence-informed, curriculum-linked learning experiences. These programs are evaluated annually to ensure they remain useful and meaningful and are designed to engage students at key points of transition in their educational journeys.

Learning experiences through the Gateway Programs include academic workshops, HSC enrichment, immersive on-campus experiences and opportunities in leadership, entrepreneurship and career development. Through these, students gain insight into university life and a clearer understanding of the academic expectations of higher education. They also begin to establish a sense of belonging through authentic connections with our trained University Ambassadors—current UNSW students, many of whom have come through the Gateway Admission Pathway and attended similar schools.

When students are ready to make informed decisions about applying to university, the Gateway Admission Pathway provides access to undergraduate degrees, alongside supported places in diplomas and preparation programs. Students who enter UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway are also prioritised for scholarships, awards, transition support and employment opportunities, providing a strong foundation as they transition to university and progress towards meaningful careers.

The progress we have made would not be possible without the support of our partner schools. We look forward to working with you and connecting your students with the Gateway Programs and Gateway Admission Pathway.

Gateway to STEM Program

Exploring real-world challenges through STEM

Gateway to STEM is an enrichment program where students investigate a real-world challenge in their local community and use science, technology, engineering and mathematics to develop a solution.

Students work in teams across classroom learning, UNSW-led experiences and hands-on learning on campus. The program concludes with a STEM Showcase, where students present their solutions to an audience of academics, teachers, parents/carers and peers.

Participating schools receive lesson plans and resources, student workbooks and access to an online platform that guides students through each of the school-based components of the program.

Who should attend

Year 9 students with a strong interest in STEM

Student learning outcomes

- ▶ Confidence and agency as STEM problem-solvers.
- ▶ Strengthened positive attitudes towards STEM and their own belonging in STEM university environments.
- ▶ An understanding of how science, engineering and technology work together to make a difference in their local community.
- ▶ Awareness of STEM study pathways, careers and future possibilities.
- ▶ Confidence in presenting ideas to an authentic audience.

Gateway Values in Action Program

Connecting personal values with future possibilities

Gateway Values in Action encourages students to explore how their values and interests influence decisions about their future. Through guided activities and conversations with University Ambassadors, students build a clearer picture of their values and begin connecting them with degrees, careers and post-school options. Schools will also receive extension resources to explore the Inside Out app with their students.

Gateway Writers Festival

Finding authentic voice through storytelling

Gateway Writers Festival connects students with published Australian authors and other young writers to learn about writing as a creative process and consider how their lived experiences, perspectives and knowledge can shape authentic stories. English teachers are also invited to participate in a professional learning workshop focused on amplifying authentic narratives, leaving with practical strategies and materials for their own classrooms.

Gateway Conversations that Matter facilitates meaningful conversations between students, their peers and University Ambassadors that encourage students to reflect on their motivating passions, strengths and future goals, while building confidence to articulate possible next steps in their post-school decision-making. Students also explore the benefits provided through Gateway in their final year of school, including digital academic resources, On-Campus Days and the Gateway Admission Pathway.

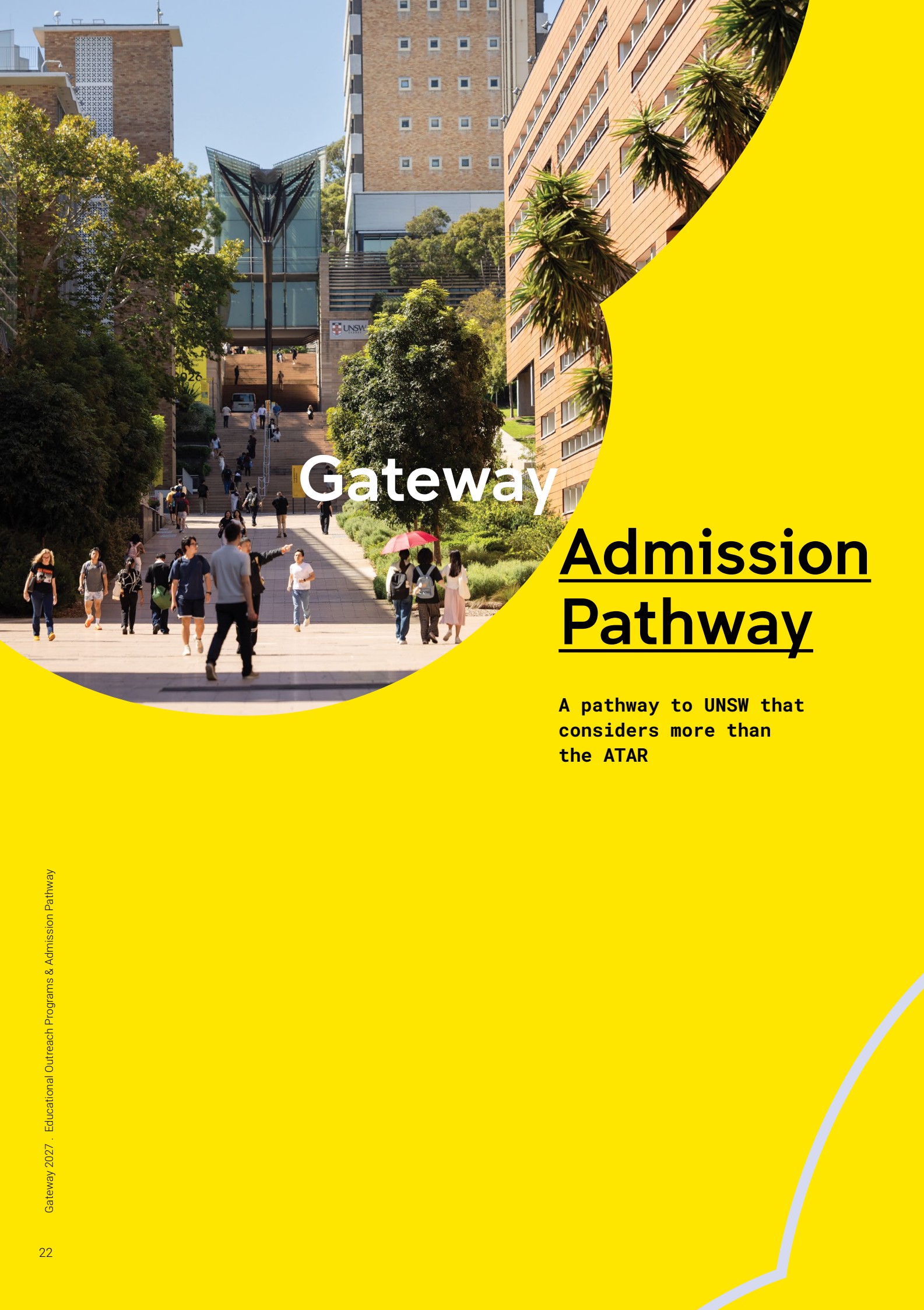

Gateway

Admission Pathway

A pathway to UNSW that considers more than the ATAR

What's on offer

Through the Gateway Admission Pathway, students can receive either a guaranteed early offer on completion of the HSC or an early conditional offer with a reduced ATAR requirement. Offers are available across a range of program types.



Undergraduate bachelor's degrees

Most UNSW Sydney undergraduate bachelor's degrees are available through the Gateway Admission Pathway, with adjusted ATAR requirements of up to 15 points below the previous year's lowest selection rank.

UNSW College Diplomas

UNSW College Diplomas follow the first-year curriculum of a relevant UNSW bachelor's degree with smaller classes and additional academic support. Students who complete a diploma can progress directly into the second year of the relevant degree.

University Preparation Program

A 12-month, fee-free program of full-time study across a range of disciplines develops the foundational academic skills students need for undergraduate study. Upon completion, students can apply for an undergraduate degree at UNSW or another university.

Indigenous Pre-Program

A three-week intensive residential program for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students that includes assessments within their chosen faculty or school. Upon successful completion, participants may be offered a place in a connected UNSW undergraduate degree.

Who can apply

To be eligible, students must:

- 1. Be an Australian/New Zealand Citizen, Australian Permanent Resident or hold an identified visa
- 2. Intend to complete an Australian Year 12 qualification in the year of application or have completed one within the past five years
- 3. Meet at least one of the following equity criteria:
 - a. Currently live in a low-socioeconomic area[^]
 - b. Are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
 - c. Attend a UNSW Gateway partner school^{^^}
 - d. Hold an eligible permanent protection, temporary protection or bridging visa^{^^}

How it works

Students apply

Students submit an online application including a personal statement responding to three short questions about themselves.

Applications are assessed

Current Year 12 students are assessed based on their Year 11 academic results and personal statement. Those who have completed Year 12 within the past five years are assessed based on their ATAR and personal statement.

Offers are released

Two rounds of offers are made with successful applicants receiving either an early offer, an early conditional offer or interview invitation.

Conversion to firm offers

Students who meet the conditions of their offer receive a firm offer to study at UNSW.

Offer types

Early offer

Students must complete the HSC and attain an ATAR, no matter the result.

Early conditional offer

Students must complete the HSC and achieve the adjusted ATAR listed in their offer letter.

Interview invitation

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students may be invited to participate in a semi-formal interview as part of the assessment process. An ATAR is not required for this process.

Scholarships & awards

Guaranteed Awards

\$1,000 Gateway Award

For students who attend a Gateway partner school^{^^}.

\$10,000 Advantage Award

For students who live in a low-socioeconomic area[^] or hold an identified visa^{^^}.

Equity Scholarships

Starting at \$5,000/yr

Equity Scholarships vary in amount and students are automatically considered as part of their Gateway Admission Pathway application.

Accommodation Scholarships

\$25,000/yr Community Plus Scholarship

The Community Plus Scholarship goes toward UNSW-operated accommodation and students are automatically considered as part of their Gateway Admission Pathway application. A separate application is required for an accommodation place.

Merit Scholarships

Starting at \$5,000/yr

Merit scholarships vary in amount, are based on academic performance and require a separate application.
