I'm pleased to share with you UNSW's 2024 educational outreach program for students attending our Gateway partner high schools.

At UNSW, we are committed to student equity and improving educational outcomes for students underrepresented in higher education. Core to UNSW's strategy is the objective of transforming our undergraduate population so that it is inclusive of all students regardless of the school they attended or area they grew up in. Our goal is that by 2027, 25% of domestic undergraduate students commencing at UNSW will be from underrepresented backgrounds.

To ensure our community is representative of the broader population, we take a holistic approach to supporting students, from pre-tertiary outreach, to academic, financial and well-being support as they transition to UNSW, through to internship and careers support for graduation and beyond.

Our educational outreach program provides students with academic enrichment opportunities that enhance school-based learning and increase preparedness for and success in higher education. We have brought together a unique set of curriculum-linked learning experiences with an embedded focus on self-efficacy, identifying learning strengths and values-led career choices.

Through our program, we seek to support and extend students' interest in their own learning and focus on higher-order thinking, metacognition, critical analysis and literacy - all essential factors for post-school success. We guide students to develop their learning goals and participate in experiences that are interactive, experiential, and explore a range of contexts that are unique to UNSW. We also provide an equitable pathway to UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway and Program.

Attending university has always been a high priority in my family. At High School I was a really engaged student and took Legal Studies as an elective, but my interest in studying law, and taking a humanitarian path, was sparked by my background and experiences as a migrant.

My mother and I immigrated from Bangladesh in 2007, when I was almost three. We had to use immigration lawyers several times over the years. When I was part way through High School we actually had to go back to Bangladesh and wait for our visa to be reinstated.

I went to Sarah Redfern High School in Minto, in Western Sydney, which was a UNSW Gateway School. My year 12 graduating class had less than 120 students and two pathways: the HSC and a transition pathway. My HSC cohort was pretty small, with just three of us in Extension English by the end, but these small classes were beneficial. There's no doubt my teachers helped me achieve the results I did.

My school's careers advisor was proactive in passing on info on university entry pathways and related programs, which led me to apply for the Gateway Spring and Winter Programs in Year

The programs offered masterclasses in key subjects like English and Maths and practice papers for the HSC. I found these beneficial because the pandemic lockdowns meant we didn't have formal trial exams, so the HSC was my first official three hour exam for nearly all of my subjects.

After participating in the Gateway Program I was keen to apply for an early conditional offer via the Gateway Admission Pathway because I could see it removed some of the barriers to entry.

I was successful in receiving an early conditional offer with an adjusted ATAR of 85. Having the offer in my pocket gave me the freedom of deciding what I really wanted to do, while knowing that it was possible to get into Law. But I really wanted to make sure that law was right for me, because I knew it was a tough degree.

I landed on UNSW because my cousin who studied there told me about the culture and UNSW offered the double degree I wanted to do, with a focus on politics and International Relations through Politics, Philosophy and

Only a handful of students from my school ended up at UNSW and, because of the pandemic, I'd never been to UNSW before I started. I was part of a Peer Mentoring program for students who enrolled through the Gateway Admission Pathway. My mentor was so helpful with practical things around how uni works. I also received check-in calls to see how I was going academically and financially - these calls made me feel supported.

Another challenge I faced in getting to uni was that I wasn't yet an Australian citizen, because my citizenship didn't get approved until March 2022 - after uni began. I was able to pay for uni with financial assistance from my grandfather, as well as scholarships. I received a \$1,000 UNSW payment, a \$5,000 Gateway award and a \$5,000 academic achievement scholarship for the highest ATAR in my school.

Right now, I'm in my second year of a combined Bachelor of Law/Politics, Philosophy and Economics. Alongside my studies I work at my old high school two days a week as a student learning support officer. I'm also a University Ambassador allowing me to give back what I received last year.

I know how uni can sometimes feel unachievable from your high school bubble. It looks like a big and scary place. You can feel like you're not good enough. I want to help other students break down those barriers.

Gateway gave me options. It allowed me to look past the stress around whether I could achieve the mark. It gave me freedom, choice and the time to understand that Law was the right degree, and career, for me.

Our program is co-facilitated by current UNSW students, most of whom have come through the Gateway Admission Pathway. University Ambassadors serve as powerful role models who demonstrate the opportunities a university education can bring.

The Gateway Leaders Program, is an on-campus experience, for select Year 11 students who demonstrate leadership capacity. They engage in a communication workshop with Jo O'Reilly, a communication expert with extensive experience at UNSW, AGSM and companies worldwide, before participating in a networking opportunity with other Year 11 students and University Ambassadors.

The **Year 11 Gateway Program** is a two-day on-campus intensive for students to explore a range of UNSW degrees through crossfaculty experiences, academic skills workshops and opportunities to be immersed in the vibrant UNSW community. This on-campus experience is supplemented by an online Gateway Admission Pathway information session and access to a suite of academically enriching online resources.

Gateway Program

A one-week online program for Year 12 students to prepare for the HSC with subject-specific masterclasses, practice tests, personalised mentoring, and academic skill-enhancing workshops. Students can access exclusive follow-up academic support and tutoring in the lead-up to exams, as well as support in submitting a Gateway Admission Pathway application to secure their place at UNSW. Students can also visit our Kensington campus for interactive faculty experiences and have their burning questions answered by University Ambassadors.

Year 9 Imagined **Futures Program**

The Imagined Futures unit is a Year 9 English curriculum-linked offering for select Sydney metropolitan schools. It engages students in considering their futures, the future world they will inhabit, and how they want to play a role in shaping it now and into the future.

This future-focused exploration is complimented by the development of students' reflexive practice and metacognitive strategies for improved awareness of learning and capacity to navigate perceptions of themselves as learners for future study.

The unit commences with an exciting on-campus day at UNSW, followed by in-school delivery by English teachers and UNSW University Ambassadors who function as both facilitators and relatable models of future possibilities for students.

Year 10 Gateway Program

The Year 10 Gateway Program is for students who are on an ATAR pathway.

During this on-campus experience, run in collaboration with the National Institute of Dramatic Art (NIDA), students attend workshops where they will gain knowledge of UNSW degrees, learn strategies to articulate and develop compelling personal narratives, and adopt practical dramatic techniques to enhance presentation and public speaking skills.

This opportunity is available to a select number of Gateway schools based on a school sign-up process.

- > When: Term 1, Weeks 3 10
- > Where: On-campus

Students will:

- Discover how their interests and aptitudes align with UNSW degrees and careers and reflect on their learning strengths
- Enhance communication skills with dramatic techniques
- Engage in small group self-reflective writing workshops
- Be inspired by different perspectives, career trajectories and experiences of University Ambassadors and UNSW Alumni

Year 11 Gateway Program

The **Gateway Leaders Program**, is a one day on-campus experience for select Year 11 students who demonstrate leadership capacity. Students will identify their leadership strengths and learn how to harness these to make an impact in their schools and communities. They will engage in a communication workshop with Jo O'Reilly, a communication expert with extensive experience at UNSW, AGSM and companies worldwide, before participating in a networking opportunity with other Year 11 students and University Ambassadors.

> When: Term 1, Weeks 7 - 9 > Where: On-campus

Students will:

- Discover how personal strengths and values can be harnessed for leadership purposes
- Learn to communicate with influence through a practical workshop
- Develop leadership goals and strategies to make an impact in their schools and communities

The in-school and online components of the Year 11 Gateway Program are for students on an ATAR pathway. During the Program, students explore their passions and learning strengths, understand the Gateway Admission Pathway and Program opportunities and are supported to start planning their written personal statement as part of their application for an early offer to UNSW in 2026.

In-school workshop – a 60-minute pre-workshop

> When: Term 2, Weeks 2 - 9 > Where: In-school

Students will:

- Reflect on their learning strengths and passions, and understand how these can help them to make informed decisions about future study plans
- Understand the UNSW Gateway Admission Pathway early offer
- Identify how to access online resources that are most relevant to them
- Learn from current university students about how they navigated their transition to university

Online resources through OpenLearning

- When: Resources available from Monday,29 April
- > Where: Online

Students will:

- Gain access to detailed information showcasing the range of degree options at UNSW
- Be supported to write a compelling personal statement and learn key information about applying through the UNSW Gateway Admission Pathway for an early offer
- Enhance their study with access to practice questions, sample responses, study notes and review videos through the InspirationED HSC4ME app

Online workshop – a 60-minute workshop

- > When: Term 2, Week 9, Wednesday 26 June, 5:00pm
- > Where: Online

The **on-campus days** encourage students to ambitiously consider the contribution they want to make to society in the future. Students explore UNSW faculties and facilities through a problem-based lens, where they select faculty teams (Business, Science, and Engineering; or Arts, Design & Architecture, Law & Justice, and Medicine & Health) to learn from and collaborate with to solve real-world problems related to the Sustainable Development Goals.

Students will have an opportunity to engage in a UNSW-developed VR game, where they will make their mark on the virtual world of UNSW through planting and growing a unique habitat for creatures on campus.

Students also engage in capacity building workshops and experiences to set themselves up for success in their HSC and beyond.

On-campus days

Students will:

- Discover campus and hear about life at UNSW on a guided tour led by current university students

- Connect with current university students to hear first-hand about the transition from high school to university

Year 12 Gateway Program

The **in-school component** of the program is for Year 12 students on an ATAR pathway. Students engage in meaningful conversations and explore their passions, learning strengths and hopes for the future. Students learn about the content and benefits of the Year 12 Gateway Program and Gateway Admission Pathway, and how it can support them towards their desired futures.

During the **online program**, students will prepare for the HSC through subject-specific exam practice and workshops led by experienced HSC teachers and markers. Students will also be supported to write their personal statement, a requirement for their Gateway Admission Pathway application.

The **on-campus days** provide students an opportunity to explore the UNSW campus and participate in university life through interaction with current students, societies and faculties. On the first day, they engage in a variety of faculty specific immersive experiences, with the opportunity to affirm their interest in degrees and/or areas of study available at UNSW. The second day offers students an experience that authentically reflects the daily life of university students and provides opportunities to independently explore UNSW through building a unique timetable and independently navigating campus while participating in degree aligned tutorials.

- · Access subject-specific HSC seminars run by HSC markers to hone their content knowledge and refine their exams skills
- · Benefit from practice papers and individualised written exam feedback to support their HSC preparation, and gain access to the InspirationED HSC4ME app for further academic support
- Gain the opportunity to receive 8 hours of free online tutoring in a subject of choice through Cluey Learning
- · Be inspired by current students and academics with their questions answered in faculty Q&As, to support making informed decisions about future degree choices
- · Connect with current UNSW students to learn about what university is really like
- Be supported with specialised guidance on the application process for early offers to UNSW and access resources for writing an effective personal statement
- · Learn about the many alternate pathways and support systems on offer at UNSW



- > When: School holidays, Week 1, Wednesday 10 and Thursday 11 July
- > Where: UNSW Kensington campus

Students will:

- Participate in immersive faculty experiences to explore the range of degrees, and poststudy careers available to UNSW students
- · Discover the UNSW campus and hear about student life through guided tours led by current students
- · Connect with current students, academics, and university support staff to have all their questions about degree options, support services, and daily life at UNSW answered
- Build a personalised timetable and attend lectures and tutorials to receive an authentic university experience

UNSW Open Day - Open Day is UNSW's final large-scale event before the HSC.

- Gain detailed advice from academics and current students about their dream degree
- Learn about the Gateway Admission Pathway early entry application process

Gateway Admission Pathway

We know that the ATAR alone is not the only measure of students' academic potential or success at university. The Gateway Admission Pathway is an alternative entry to UNSW for eligible Year 12 students which provides early entry or a significantly lower ATAR entry requirement for a range of degrees.

Who is eligible?

To be eligible for the Gateway Admission Pathway, students must:

- · Be an Australian resident
- Be completing an Australian Year 12 qualification in the year of application
- · Attend a Gateway school or live in a low-socioeconomic area based on IRSAD and IEO indexes of SEIFA

How does it work?

Students apply through the Gateway portal by submitting a written personal statement that answers three questions about themselves. The applications are assessed based on students' personal statements and Year 11 results. Successful students will receive either an early offer or early conditional offer for their chosen UNSW degree.

What is the difference between an early offer and early conditional offer?

Early offers for a UNSW degree are made in Round 1 and only require a student to complete the HSC and attain an ATAR (regardless of the result).

Early conditional offers require students to complete the HSC and achieve the Gateway Adjusted ATAR for their chosen UNSW degree.

The Gateway Adjusted ATARs provide students with a significantly lower ATAR than the lowest selection rank.

When do applications close and when are offers released?

In 2024, there will be two offer rounds for the Gateway Admission Pathway:

Round 1: early offers and early conditional offers

Applications open - April 2024 Applications close - July 2024 Offers released - September 2024

Round 2: early conditional offers

Applications open - September 2024 Applications close - November 2024 Offers released - December 2024

Firm offers, post ATAR release: December 2024


Students who come to UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway are prioritised for scholarships and receive exclusive access to ongoing academic and transition support.
