


# Bachelor of Aviation (Management) Structure 2023

The minimum units for graduation = 144 Units of Credit (UOC)

Each stage = 48UOC



#### **Prescribed Electives**

Prescribed Electives are courses taken from within the School of Aviation, as defined in the UNSW Online Handbook (handbook.unsw.edu.au)

#### **Free Electives**

Free Electives may be any course from Aviation or any other Faculty at UNSW. The School of Aviation recommends taking Aviation or UNSW Business School courses as free electives.

### **Recommended Free Electives**

- → If you are looking for first year business courses to broaden your commercial understanding, consider: COMM1140 Financial Management, COMM1100 Business Decision Making, COMM1110 Evidence-Based Problem Solving, COMM1120 Collaboration and Innovation in Business, ECON1101 Microeconomics, ECON1102 Macroeconomics (has ECON1101 as prerequisite).
- → If you are interested in enhanced aviation data analytics and optimisation modelling, consider AVIA2601 Aviation Operations Research.
- → If you are interested in practical knowledge in regional and general aviation, consider AVIA2801 Regional and General Aviation.
- → For theories and practice in drone management, air traffic management, safety management and airport management, consider AVIA2025 Introduction to Airborne Drone Management, AVIA3301 Simulation Application and Air Traffic Management, AVIA3013 Workplace Safety, or AVIA3851 Airport Management 2.
- → If you are interested gaining more knowledge in aviation and sustainable development, consider AVIA2910 Air Transport: Economics and the Environment, AVIA3900 Sustainable Aviation and Tourism or AVIA3910 Environmental Performance Evaluation of Aviation: Theories and Techniques.
- → If you are interested in gaining more depth in aviation law, consider AVIA3410 Advanced Law and Regulation in Aviation.
