Highlights

The Centre staff are continuing to work hard, albeit largely from home under restrictions due to the COVID-19. The skeleton staff, working in the Centre and Hubs, are safe and exercising all the social distancing and hand washing practices. The Centre's work now includes assisting NSW Health and local health districts in responding to the pandemic. For example, some staff have been involved in contact tracing and helping services to implement rapid changes such as the use of telehealth. All our other work continues, although it has been more challenging to deal with health service providers because of the increased demands under the COVID-19 pandemic.

Projects

The Centre has been conducting an evaluation of the community involvement strategy in Waterloo. In 2019 the SLHD engaged the CPHCE, led by A/Prof Margo Barr, to review the Waterloo Healthy Living Program. The purpose of the review was to assess how effectively the program has achieved the expectations of the community and the SLHD, and to propose options or recommendations to enhance the Program and to develop similar programs across SLHD. The review included a position establishment and current work review; key informant interviews to assess the impact of the program; and a literature reviews to identify and examine the impact and enablers for the success of other similar roles.
