



**Invitation to participate in this clinical trial study**

**Comparative efficacy of artificial tears in the management of dry eye disease**

Researchers at UNSW are conducting a study to compare the effects of using artificial tears for treating different types of dry eye

**Investigators:** Associate Professor Maria Markoulli, Professor Eric Papas, Dr. Azadeh Tavakkolinasab, and Abel Sinshaw Assem (PhD candidate)

**The research study is looking to recruit people who meet the following criteria:**

- Participants with the age of  $\geq 18$  years
- Have symptoms and signs of dry eye disease
- Willing to use commercially available artificial tear supplements.

**Participants meeting the following criteria will be excluded from the study:**

Active ocular infection, contact lens usage, intense pulse light therapy within 6 months prior to study, ocular surgery and trauma within three months prior to study, history of epilepsy or seizures, pregnant and a plan to become pregnant within one year, and known hypersensitivity to components of Systane and NovaTears lubricants, fluorescein or lissamine green dye, and anaesthetic drops.

**Participants who agree to participate will be required to:**

Attend a total of six visits at the School of Optometry & Vision Science UNSW, with three visits during each treatment period: at baseline, one month, and three months, and each visit will roughly take 60 minutes to complete the eye examination and tear collection.
