About this report




This report is about a project **led by people** with intellectual **disability** for other people with disability.

About Our Voice SA



Our Voice SA is a **peer led self advocacy** group for people with intellectual disability.



Peer led means people with intellectual disability run the group and are part of the group.



Self advocacy means having a say about things that matter to you.



Our Voice SA has over **100** active **members**.



Our Voice SA meets monthly.



Our Voice SA does **things to help** people with intellectual disability like.



Feel part of their **community**.



Know their **rights**.



Speak out about the things that matter to them.



Help **services and government** to work better with people with intellectual disability.

The **Reaching Out Project** wanted to connect to more people with intellectual disability.



The project was for 3 years.



The project worked with people with intellectual disability in **South Australia**.




It worked with **people** in the **city** and the **country**.

How we did the study



The study used co design.

Co design means a person with intellectual disability helped with the study.



We **talked** to **members** at Our Voice SA.



We **talked** to people who **work** for Our Voice SA.



We **looked at** other **information** about Our Voice SA.

What did Our Voice SA do well?



Our Voice SA achieved many great things in the Reaching Out project like.



Worked with services that run group homes or group employment.



Set up peer groups in 9 communities.



Run workshops for people living in the country and in the city.



Organised many peer groups.

Peer groups help people with disability connect with each other.



Supported people with intellectual disability to become peer leaders.

What the Reaching Out project achieved



Over 3 years, Our Voice SA grew **stronger** and bigger.



Many new members joined from different services and parts of South Australia.



People were **better connected** to their peers.



People with disability were more **skilled** and **confident** to speak up.



Some members **became leaders**, and some had paid roles.



The community respected Our Voice SA for their knowledge.



Our Voice SA **have a voice** to speak out for people with intellectual disability.

Future of Our Voice SA and self advocacy



Reaching Out achieved many good things for people with disability in South Australia.



People with disability **connected and learned** about their rights through peer groups.



Ongoing **funding** for Our Voice SA and self advocacy remains a problem.
