# **Program and Course Terminology**

Terminology	Definition
Introductory Business Core Course	Students must complete a 6UOC (1 course) of Introductory Business core course.
<b>Economics Core Courses</b>	Students must complete 48UOC (8 courses) of level 1 and 2 Economics Core Courses.
Economics Electives	Students must complete 30UOC (5 courses) of Economics electives or accepted substitutes of Economics electives to ensure a student completes a <b>minimum of </b> 78 UOC (13 courses) of Economics courses across the program.
Optional Economics Majors	Students may wish to complete an optional Economics major(s) (ECONV1, ECONT1, ECONU1). If students do not complete an optional Economics major(s), students will complete program with a default major by completing program requirements.  If you choose to study 2 optional Economics majors, you must choose another 36UOC (6 courses) from the second major that do not overlap with the first major.
Business School Electives	Students must complete a minimum 12UOC (2 courses) of courses within the Business School. Students are free to use these UOC to complete courses from the Business School, however they need to be mindful of the program level 1 limit when making their selection. GEN courses cannot count as Business School electives.
Level 1 limit	The maximum level one limit in this degree is 60UOC (10 courses)
