We are currently recruiting 2nd year psychology students to participate in the School of Psychology 2023 Peer Mentoring Program.

Who is eligible?

You will need to be entering Stage 3 of your program in 2023 and enrolled in a Bachelor of Psychology or Bachelor of Psychological Science, or another program with a major in Psychology

What does mentoring involve?

Working with a partner to mentor a small group of 1st year psychology students to guide their transition to university.

Why volunteer to be a Mentor?

- Enhance your personal and professional development;
- Enjoy a sense of community within the UNSW School of Psychology;
- Receive an official School of Psychology Peer Mentoring Certificate;
- Receive acknowledgement of your participation on your supplementary transcript of UNSW approved activities; and
- Acquire skills to include on your resume and enhance your employability.

How much time will being a Mentor take?

- A one-day mentor training workshop in early February 2023;
- One-hour weekly meetings with a small group of mentees for approximately 8 weeks during Term 1 2023;
- Short fortnightly meetings with the Peer Mentoring Coordinators during this time; and
- A small amount of preparation for each mentoring session.
