Program and Course Terminology

Terminology	Definition
Credit Transfer	<u>Credit transfer</u> is also known as 'advanced standing' or recognition for prior learning (RPL), where students can apply for previous study from another institution to be applied as credit to a student's current degree at UNSW.
Disciplinary Component	Students must complete 96 UOC (16 courses) of Criminology Core, Social Science Core and Prescribed Criminology Elective courses to satisfy the core requirements of this program.
Criminology Core	Students must complete 42 UOC (7 courses) in Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3 Criminology Core courses.
Social Science Core	Students must complete 36 UOC (6 courses) in Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3 Social Science Core courses.
Prescribed Criminology Electives	Students must complete 18 UOC (3 courses) of Prescribed Criminology Electives.
Free Electives	Students must complete 36 UOC (6 courses) of Free Electives. When selecting Free Electives students are encouraged to enrol in Criminology Prescribed Elective courses in addition to the 18 UOC undertaken in the Disciplinary component of the program.
General Education	Students must complete 12 UOC (2 courses) of General Education courses in line with UNSW General Education Rules.
Overall Program UOC	Students must complete a 144 UOC (24 courses) across Core, Prescribed Electives, Free Electives and General Education courses to fulfil program requirements.
Double Degree	Students wishing to undertake the Bachelor of Social Work (Honours)/Criminology and Criminal Justice double degree must complete 240 UOC (40 courses) across the 4033 Social Work (Honours) Disciplinary Component (168 UOC), and 3342 Criminology and Criminal Justice Disciplinary Component (96 UOC).

Advanced Diploma

Students who have completed an **Advanced Diploma of Community Sector Management** (AQF Level 6) will be offered credit transfer of 48 UOC towards the BCCJ. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. SOSS1000 Policy and Society (6 UOC)
- 2. Free Electives (30 UOC)
- 3. General Education (12 UOC)

Students who have completed an **Advanced Diploma of Public Safety (Emergency Management)** (AQF Level 6) will be offered credit transfer of 48 UOC towards the BCCJ. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. Free Electives (36 UOC)
- 2. General Education (12 UOC)



Diploma

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Public Safety (Emergency Management)** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of 36 UOC towards the BCCJ. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. Free Electives (24 UOC)
- 2. General Education (12 UOC)

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Paralegal Services** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of 36 UOC towards the BCCJ. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. Prescribed Criminology Elective (6 UOC)
- 2. Free Electives (18 UOC)
- 3. General Education (12 UOC)

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Government, Community Services, Youth Work, Alcohol and Other Drugs,** or **Counselling** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of 36 UOC towards the BCCJ. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. SOSS1000 Policy and Society (6 UOC)
- 2. Free Electives (18 UOC)
- 3. General Education (12 UOC)

Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) / Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice – Double Degree (4034)

TAFE pathways have been developed for both the BSW (Hons) and BCCJ as standalone programs. Students wishing to undertake the BSW (Hons) / BCCJ that have completed an **Advanced Diploma of Community Sector Management** (AQF Level 6), or **Diploma of Paralegal Services**, **Diploma of Alcohol and Other Drugs**, **Diploma of Community Services**, **Diploma of Counselling**, **Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care**, **Diploma of Financial Counselling**, **Diploma of Government**, **Diploma of Youth Work**, **Diploma of Mental Health** (AQF 5), or **Bachelor of Community Services** will be awarded credit transfer of 36 UOC towards the double degree. Credit will be given for the following:



- 1. ARTS1870 Rethinking the Social (6 UOC)
- 2. SOSS1000 Policy and Society (6 UOC)
- 3. SOCW1004 Lifespan, Health and Resilience (6 UOC)
- 4. ARTS2871 Power and Powerlessness (6 UOC)
- 5. SOCW2008 Culture, Identity and Diversity (6 UOC)
- 6. ARTS1753 Culture, Experience and Change (6 UOC)

Three of the core courses (18 UOC) in Criminology and Criminal Justice, **SOSS1000**, **SOSS1001** and **ARTS2871** are also part of the core for Social Work (Honours). These three courses will be double counted towards the double degree.

Credit will also be considered for TAFE qualifications that supersede any of the above. Once this credit has been applied, students will have some terms with a lighter load of courses.
